Greater Toledo Community Foundation Sponsors a Day of Family Fun at Black Swamp Conservancy on Saturday, April 29th, noon - 4:00 p.m.

Toledo, Ohio, April 21, 2023— Greater Toledo Community Foundation (GTCF) is celebrating its 50th Anniversary, “Fifty Years of Funding Futures,” with a yearlong calendar of events and programs in 2023. On Saturday, April 29th, it will sponsor a day of family fun at the Black Swamp Homestead, 4825 Sugar Ridge Road, in Pemberville. The day will feature a community paint-by-number mural by Toledo native and New Orleans-based artist, Madison Roy. There will also be guided hikes through Bell Woods, live music by Chloe and the Steel Strings, family lawn games, food trucks and much more.

Of special interest for the day will be the community paint-by-number mural. Community members will be asked to help create a mural to commemorate the day. It will be designed by artist Madison Roy. For years, Roy was a permanent artist featured at The Gallery at The Davis Building in downtown Toledo. A highlight of her residency was working collaboratively with the other artists on a community mural for The Davis Building.

After relocating to New Orleans, Roy expanded upon her passion for designing and painting murals. This is reflected in her murals located throughout the city that burst with vibrant colors and expressive designs—truly capturing the energy of the city.

Since 2014, Roy has been a Fender Custom Shop artist. She works with Fender Masterbuilders, like Greg Fessler, to paint one-of-a-kind designs on their custom-built guitars.

She is donating much of her time and talent to this project. She stated, “I am excited to give back to the community that raised me and to support conservation in northwest Ohio. I value the work that Black Swamp Conservancy does to preserve the rural heritage, unique natural habitats, and streams of northwest Ohio, now and for future generations.”
